

Nominations for Election as Director of Hills Football Incorporated

20 February 2024

INTRODUCTION

Hills Football Incorporated (Hills Football) is seeking nominations for three (3) Directors to stand for election as a Director of Hills Football at its Annual General Meeting to be held on Monday, 20 May 2024.

This document explains the process, criteria and timeline for the election of Directors. In addition to this document, all Candidates should read the Hills Football Constitution which can be found by <u>clicking here</u>.

PROCESS

Completion of Documents

In accordance with the Hills Football Constitution, Candidates must complete the following documentation:

1. Director Nomination Form

The Director Nomination Form contains two (2) parts which must be completed by all Candidates. Those parts are as follows:

- **First Part Proposers:** All Candidates require authorised representatives of **two** Hills Football member-clubs (**Proposers**) to nominate them to stand for election as a Director of Hills Football at its Annual General Meeting to be held on Monday, 20 May 2024.
- **Second Part Consent to Act**: All Candidates are required to complete, sign and date the Nominee Director Consent to Act form.

The Director Nomination Form is attached in Annexure 1 below.

2. Nominations Criteria

All Candidates must demonstrate whether they meet the criteria as set out in clause 18.5 of the Hills Football Constitution and provided under the heading "Criteria" on page 4 below.

Please insert your response to the criteria in Annexure 2 below.

NOMINATIONS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED IF THEY ARE NOT ACCOMPANIED BY THE ABOVEMENTIONED DOCUMENTS AS SET OUT IN ANNEXURES 1 AND 2.

PLEASE BE ADVISED THAT HILLS FOOTBALL MAY NOT REVIEW NOMINATIONS FOR COMPLETENESS AHEAD OF THE DUE DATE AND THE ONUS IS ON CANDIDATES TO ENSURE THAT ALL DOCUMENTATION AND REQUIRED INFORMATION IS PROVIDED TO HILLS FOOTBALL BY THE DUE DATE.

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ROLE OF THE NOMINATIONS COMMITTEE

Consideration by Nominations Committee

Upon receipt of the abovementioned documentation, Hills Football will distribute all nominations to the Nominations Committee pursuant to clause 18.5 of the Hills Football Constitution.

Nomination Committee

The Nominations Committee will comprise at least three (3) of the following individuals:

- 1. the Chairman of the Sydney Hills Business Chamber or their nominee; and/or
- 2. the Chief Executive Officer of the Office of Sport or their nominee; and/or
- 3. the Chief Executive Officer of a State Sporting Organisation or their nominee; and/or
- 4. a State member of parliament or their nominee; and/or
- 5. a Federal member of parliament or their nominee.

The Nominations Committee must consider each Candidate for election as a Director and will assess:

- 1. the commitment of the Candidate to a strong governance regime for Hills Football;
- 2. the commitment of the Candidate to Hills Football's development of policies and strategies for football generally throughout the region;
- 3. whether the Candidate has been involved in activities which could, or could reasonably be perceived to, materially interfere with the Candidate's ability to act in the best interests of Hills Football;
- 4. whether the Candidate is free from any interest and any relationship which could, or could reasonably be perceived to, materially interfere with the Candidate's ability to act in the best interests of Hills Football; and
- 5. whether the Candidate satisfies the Core Competencies (as set out below under the heading "Criteria"),

and must, in its absolute discretion and acting in good faith, approve or reject the Candidate to stand for election as a Director.

The Hills Football Constitution provides, in clause 18.5(d), that unless the Nominations Committee approves a Candidate, the Candidate is not eligible to stand for election as a Director at the next Annual General Meeting. The next Annual General Meeting will be on Monday 20 May 2024.

A decision made by the Nominations Committee under clause 18.5 of the Hills Football Constitution is final and not subject to challenge.

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CRITERIA

In accordance with clause 18.5 of the Hills Football Constitution, the Candidate must possess each of the following core competencies:

- 1. Demonstrated leadership at a senior level in an environment compatible with the requirements of Hills Football;
- 2. Demonstrated commitment to strong governance principles and an understanding and appreciation of the duties and responsibilities of the role of Director;
- 3. A commitment to and record of ethical behaviour including not having been the subject of an adverse finding or the current subject of an inquiry or investigation by any statutory, regulatory or law enforcement authority or agency including a disciplinary body of FNSW, FFA or Hills Football relating to any serious ethical matter; and
- 4. Must possess at least one of the following:
 - (a) legal qualifications (LLB or equivalent);
 - (b) accounting/finance qualifications (CA, CPA, CFA or equivalent);
 - (c) football administration experience through serving as a club or association president;
 - (d) business experience and/or qualifications;
 - (e) technology experience and/or qualifications (IT, Technology degree, CIO or equivalent position); or
 - (f) marketing, communications, government relations or public relations experience at a senior level.
