Casual Coach

Reporting Manager:

Football Development Officers (Participation and Development Lead) & Football Development Manager

Functional Relationships:

Hills Football (HFI) General Manager, HFI staff, Member Clubs, council, suppliers, various external stakeholders

Position Overview:

This role is responsible for assisting the delivery and coordination of the relevant Hills Football Development Programs with a focus on engagement and player development.

The Casual Coach, with the support of the Football Development Officers and Manager, will conduct and coach designated sessions in Hills Football Development Programs whilst also assisting to facilitate the continued growth of football within the Hills District.

Key Responsibilities:

Reporting directly to the Football Development Manager or the Football Development Officers, the Casual Coach will be responsible for the conduction of designated Hills Football Development Program sessions and other tasks as mandated by HFI Staff. This includes (but not limited to):

- Conduct and Coach designated session within Hills Football Development Programs under the guidance of HFI Staff. Hills Football Development Programs include:
 - HF Development Little Legends, HF Development Academy, HF Development Club Player Program, Holiday Clinics, Come n Try Days and more.
- Administer and deliver HFI Clerical and Administrative tasks as required by HFI Staff. HFI Clerical and Administrative tasks include:
 - Activations, Hills 7s Cup, Summer Football, Gala Days, Office Work if required.
- Ensure all tasks undertaken and delivered to the best of your ability and in a professional manner.
- Ensure all tasks assigned by the Football Development Manager and HFI Staff are conducted with all workplace and participant health and safety requirements.



- Attend all staff meetings, workshops, and training as required.
- Wear the provided Hills Football uniform unless otherwise stated.

Selection Criteria:

- Strong communication (written and verbal) skills.
- Familiarity and experience with community coaching and the FA National Football Curriculum.
- Understanding of the HF Development Philosophy.
- Understanding of the levels of Football and HFI Member Clubs.
- Ability to properly identify and develop footballers.
- Ability to actively engage and communicate with participants between the ages of 3-16.
- Understanding of the Football Environment within the Hills District.
- Ability to work independently and part of a broader team.
- Demonstrated experience within football (e.g. player, coach, administrator, referee etc)
- A current NSW driver's license.
- Paid Working with Children Check Clearance.
